- Have you used a variety of sentence starters?

Challenge:

Draw or trace a map of Europe and mark on the capital cities.

Steps to success:

- Use a computer to look at a map of Europe
- Try to be as accurate as possible when marking your locations.

Challenge:

Can you pick one of the places you have marked on your map and share some more details about it?

- Think about what food is local the UK.
- Remember to take a photo!
