

## Summer 2 - Tomb Raiders

- Pick one task each week and spend around 30 minutes completing the task

<p><b>Create a Pharaoh's head dress!</b> What did a pharaoh's head dress look like? Were there any symbols attached to the head dress? What did the symbols represent?</p> <p><u>Steps to success:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Research what a pharaoh's head dresses would include</li> <li>• Use bold colours to decorate</li> </ul>	<p><b>Post Card from Egypt</b> Write a postcard in role as Howard Carter. You will write it to one of your siblings about your amazing discovery.</p> <p><u>Steps to success:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Include powerful adjectives to describe inside tomb and how feel.</li> <li>• Include what you will do with your discovery</li> </ul> <p><u>Challenge:</u> Challenge yourself to include present perfect tense (have or has)</p>	<p><b>Artefacts for Sale!</b> Make a poster advertising an ancient Egyptian artefact of your choice.</p> <p><u>Steps to success:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Use persuasive language (including rhetorical questions and expanded noun phrases)</li> <li>• Write neatly</li> <li>• Eye catching illustration of your product</li> </ul> <p><u>Challenge:</u> Include a fact about the purpose of the artefact</p>
<p><b>Inside a Pyramid</b> Make a model of the inside of a pyramid. Ask your teacher for examples.</p> <p><u>Steps to success:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Research what was normally put kept inside pyramids</li> <li>• Label the different parts of the pyramid</li> </ul> <p><u>Challenge:</u> Include an explanation of why some of the artefacts were included in the pyramid.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><b>Tomb Raiders</b></p> 	<p><b>Create a Hieroglyph Mat</b> Create your own hieroglyph mat to help people write in ancient Egyptian.</p> <p><u>Steps to success:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Write neatly</li> <li>• Make sure your symbols are clearly drawn.</li> </ul>
<p><b>How to Mummify a Pharaoh</b> Write instructions for mummifying a Pharaoh. Do not forget to include illustrations to make sure your instructions are clear enough to follow.</p> <p><u>Steps to success:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Make sure your instructions are in chronological order!</li> <li>• Include list of equipment needed</li> </ul> <p><u>Challenge:</u> Challenge yourself by using fronted adverbials of time to order your instructions.</p>	<p><b>Make a Canopic Jar</b> Make a canopic jar to store all the important organs for your mummy. Do not forget to label the jar with hieroglyphs because they will need them in the afterlife!</p> <p><u>Steps to success:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Write out label in English before finding the hieroglyph that represent them</li> <li>• Make sure your symbols are clearly drawn</li> </ul>	<p><b>Make an Amulet</b> Make a salt dough Egyptian amulet. Ask your teacher for examples of amulets. <b>Recipe:</b> You will need Salt, Flour and Water</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Combine the flour and salt in a large mixing bowl.</li> <li>2. Gradually add water while stirring and mixing to form a dough with a Play-Doh like consistency.</li> <li>3. Form the dough into a ball and knead for approximately 5-7 minutes, until the dough is smooth and firm. Additional water may be needed, depending upon humidity. Add a teaspoon of water at a time until the dough reaches the proper texture. On the other hand, if the dough is too sticky, add more flour by the teaspoon until it's no longer tacky.</li> <li>4. Store the salt dough in a Ziploc bag when it's not in use to prevent it from drying out.</li> </ol> <p><u>Steps to success:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Research types of amulets</li> <li>• Decorate with bold colours</li> </ul>
